

## Pupil Premium Analysis for Rudheath Primary Academy

During the academic year 2014-15 the academy received £77,300. This money was spent on providing:

- Training and development of the ELS. The majority of children that the ELSA works with are identified Pupil Premium children.
- Teaching assistants who have provided 1-2-1 and small group interventions.
- Funding has also ensured that Pupil Premium children have been able to attend residential / day trips
- The 'Magic man' has worked with a number of children on developing self esteem.

The impact of this has been seen in:

- ✓ Improved educational outcomes
- ✓ Children are now a lot more confident and overcoming fears of talking / sharing in front of others.
- ✓ Improved social, emotional and behaviour of Pupil Premium pupils.
- ✓ Improved speech and language skills of Pupil Premium pupils
- ✓ Improved pupil wellbeing through enrichment activities and visits
- In Y1 there were 4 pupil premium children.
  - Reading: 1 met, 3 working within, 0 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
  - Writing: 0 met, 4 working within, 0 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
  - Maths: 1 met, 3 working within, 0 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
- In Y2 there were 8 pupil premium children.
  - Reading: Pupil Premium children made an average of 4APS compared to 4.6APS
  - Writing: Pupil Premium children made an average of 2.8APS compared to 3.8APS
  - Maths: Pupil Premium children made an average of 4.1APS compared to 5.1APS
- In Y3 there were 5 pupil premium children.
  - Reading: 0 met, 2 working within, 3 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.

- Writing: 0 met, 2 working within, 3 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
- Maths: 0 met, 2 working within, 3 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
- In Y4 there were 10 pupil premium children.
  - Reading: 0 met, 9 working within, 1 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
  - Writing: 0 met, 8 working within, 2 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
  - Maths: 0 met, 9 working within, 1 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
- In Y5 there were 8 pupil premium children.
  - Reading: 1 met, 6 working within, 1 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
  - Writing: 0 met, 7 working within, 1 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
  - Maths: 1 met, 6 working within, 1 working below and 0 exceeding expectations.
- In Y6 there were 9 pupil premium children.
  - Reading: Pupil Premium children made an average of 1.3APS compared to 1.6APS
  - Writing: Pupil Premium children made an average of 3.3APS compared to 3.0APS
  - Maths: Pupil Premium children made an average of 1.1APS compared to 2.3APS
