September 2013 - September 2014

During the academic year 2013-2014 we received £64,364 in Pupil Premium Funding. We allocated this to be spent on:

- in-class teaching support
- a range of intervention strategies to remove barriers to learning and enhance progress for children who are below national expectation of attainment in Literacy and Mathematics
- improvements to continual provision in Early Years
- subsidies for educational visits within and beyond the school day e.g Petty Pool, Delamere, Tattenhall, Mid-Cheshire College
- family support for parents and children facing difficult circumstances to improve attendance and
- ensure access to the full curriculum for some children. The impact has been:
 - In Reading 88% children made accelerated progress in Early Years, 84% children achieved L2c+ in Reading at KS1 and 89% achieved L4+ in reading in KS2
 - In Writing 92% children made accelerated progress in Early Years, 74% children achieved L2c+ in Writing at KS1 and 86% achieved L4+ in Writing in KS2
 - Accelerated progress for children in receipt of 1:1 tuition
 - A broader and richer curriculum through exciting "hooks for learning" and off-site visits.
 - Improved attendance for 60% of low attenders. Overall attendance is now 95.4% which is broadly in-line with national

September 2012 – September 2013

Schools and academies receive additional funding for any pupils who have been eligible for free school meals during the last six years; pupils who are looked after by the local authority or who are in care and for pupils from families where a parent serves in the armed forces. This money is known as the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG).

During the academic year 2012-2013, 62 pupils were eligible for funding and we received £37140. This money was spent on providing:

- In -class teaching support
- a range of intervention strategies
- financial support for residential visits.
