

Sports Premium Analysis for Rudheath Primary Academy

In the academic year 2014-2015 the academy received £9050 and used the funding in the following way:

- £1966 has been spent securing continuing partnership with the Vale Royal School Sports Partnership.
- £1500 has been spent on additional sports clubs for out of hours. These clubs have been run by external bodies and allow additional extra-curricular activities to occur for all children in school.
- £3000 was spent on the installation of large gym equipment – a large climbing frame unit in the main hall. This provides all teachers with additional resources to deliver high quality gymnastics lessons, suitable for all age groups under proper supervision.
- £2000 has been saved towards bringing in a dance teacher for Rudheath. School is currently in contact with a teacher through the Vale Royal Partnership who will work with teachers on a mentoring program to create high quality dance lessons and to help deliver them with staff throughout the year.

Next steps for 2015-16:

- Audit PE equipment to identify areas for investment that will directly impact ability to attend competitive out of school activities and tournaments. For example, purchasing netball equipment in order to attend local competitions.
- Identify new gym equipment to replace out dated items. Also invest in new equipment that can be used in conjunction with new climbing frame.
- Invest money into additional clubs/reduce the cost for families to send their children to extra-curricular sports clubs. Reducing the barrier for entry will allow for greater numbers of participation.
- Apply for Sainsbury's Sports Mark.
